

## 2021 JSP Jumpstart Summer Program Safety Procedures

### To participate, parents and students will agree with the IDPH Safety Guidelines:

- a. Complete Health Questionnaire before leaving home for the JSP Jumpstart program — students need to stay home if they answer YES to any of the three questions. Inform the school by calling 312-842-8546.
- b. Take temperature before leaving home and temperature will again be taken before the student enters the facility.

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### Health Questionnaire:

- NO  YES Have your child received a confirmed diagnosis for coronavirus (COVID-19) by a coronavirus (COVID-19) test or from a diagnosis by a healthcare professional in the past 14 days?
- NO  YES Have your child had close contact with someone diagnosed with COVID-19 within the last 14 days?
- NO  YES Have your child experienced any cold or flu-like symptoms in the last 14 days (to include: fever or temperature of greater than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit/38 degrees Celsius, cough, difficulty breathing, sore throat, pressure in the chest, extreme fatigue earache, persistent headache, diarrhea, and persistent loss of smell or taste)?

**If NO is selected: Your child is ALLOWED TO ENTER THE BUILDING.**

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1. General practices:
  - a. Properly fitted masks are required at all times except when eating and drinking.
  - b. Social Distancing will be practiced:
    - i. One student per desk, chairs at least 6 feet apart.
    - ii. Students will stay in an assigned classroom.
  - c. Hand sanitizer will be available and handwashing will be practiced regularly.
  - d. Extra staff are hired for frequent and extensive cleaning of desks, classrooms, bathrooms, and common areas.
2. Students should only bring:
  - A water bottle with their name on it. A pencil box with writing tools in it (The box will stay in school until the end of the program).
3. Dismissal Procedures
  - Students stay in classrooms or designated locations until their names are announced for pick up.

### Procedures for Students Experiencing Symptoms at Program

If a student is observed or reported to have the following symptoms while at the program, the student will be placed in a designated isolation area while the parent or guardian are contacted to pick them up. Symptoms can include but not limited to:

## Decision-Making Matrix

The following matrix will be used by the JSP Jumpstart staff to make healthy decisions for the sake of the whole community, per guidelines by the CDC.

<b>Symptomatic — 1+ Symptom, Tested Positive</b>	<b>Symptomatic — 1+ Symptom, Tested Negative</b>

Respiratory symptoms have improved. 10 calendar days have passed since symptoms appeared. Documentation of 2 negative tests at least 24 hours apart.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>A student or employee can return to campus when the following conditions have been met:</b></p> <p>Fever has been gone for 24 hours without fever reducing medicine.</p>
<b>Asymptomatic — Tested Positive</b>	<b>Untested — 1+ Symptom</b>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>A student or employee can return to camp when the following conditions have been met:</b></p> <p>10 calendar days have elapsed without symptoms. Have a written release from a health care provider.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>A student or employee can return to camp when the following conditions have been met:</b></p> <p>Fever — free for 72 hours without fever-reducing medicine. Other symptoms have improved. 10 calendar days have passed since symptoms first appeared.</p>
<b>Contact w/ Someone Who Tested Positive</b>	<b>Household Member — Symptomatic</b>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>A student or employee can return to camp when the following conditions have been met:</b></p> <p>Completed a self-quarantine for 10 days. Written release by a health care provider.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>A student or employee can return to camp when the following conditions have been met:</b></p> <p>They have remained at home for at least 72 hours. Mrs. Karen Lee has received confirmation of a negative COVID-19 test for the household member.</p>
